

Florida-Friendly Landscaping™ Collaboration (Agent & MG)

This award recognizes **the Agent and Master Gardener (or team)** that have made outstanding effort in collaborating on projects/activities while working together in their respective roles. Total effort is judged collectively on the successful collaboration over a number of projects and degree of involvement. This award will be judged on the initiative of the Master Gardener(s) to help the Agent and the Agent's ability to provide direction to the Master Gardener(s). Nominees may self-submit or may be nominated by others.

Below is a suggested outline for the project narrative.

- **Summary** (10 points)
 - A descriptive summary of the role played by both the Master Gardener(s) and the Agent when working together. Provide the length of time you have worked in your respective FFL roles, the number of hours served, and the amount of time you have worked together. Your application will NOT be judged without this summary included.
- **Projects, Roles, and Leadership Activities** (40 points)
 - Give a brief description/explanation of the projects and activities you have done together, how each of you has been involved and collaborated. Were there any leadership roles taken over by the Master Gardener(s)?
- **Educational Impact** (30 points)
 - What was the educational impact of the projects that the Master Gardener(s) has provided on behalf of the Agent? What roles do the Master Gardener(s) and Agent play in educating other volunteers or Master Gardeners? How has the Agent relied on the Master Gardener(s) to provide education to the general public?
- **Extension Impact** (15 points)
 - What impact has the Agent and Master Gardener(s) had on the community? Provide a written account with pictures (optional). Describe any publicity received for projects completed together. What roles do the Agent and Master Gardener(s) usually play in projects completed together? What was the potential impact on the community or audience?
- **Learnings** (5 points)
 - Describe any challenges encountered over the duration of the Agent and Master Gardener's relationship and how the challenges were overcome.
