This award recognizes the individual educator who has made exceptional efforts in supporting the FFL program through research, collaboration, projects, and/or other activities. The Jury will consider the projects, roles, leadership activities, and educational impact that the educator has made to further the mission of the FFL program.

Typical Entries Include: UF/IFAS Extension Agents, FFL Coordinators, Master Gardeners, and other FFL educators. Nominees may self-submit or may be nominated by others.

Below is a suggested outline for the project narrative.

- Projects, Roles, and Leadership Activities (30 points)
 - Number of projects and leadership activities.
 - Size of project collaborations

- Educational Impact (40 points)
 - What was the educational impact of the project(s) (ex. Change in attitude or practice due to your efforts, number of people reached, benefits to clients, etc.)?

- FFL Impact (30 points)
 - Impact the educator has had on the FFL Program to extend the value and reach of the program.
